Annual Review of ICF-NT Bylaws

According to the ICF-North Texas Bylaws, the Board of Directors are required to review, or direct a review of, the Bylaws annually to determine if any modifications or amendments are necessary. The bylaws have been reviewed. Proposed amendment revisions were presented to the Board of Directors at their monthly meeting on August 11, 2017. The Board of Directors unanimously accepted the revisions. The most notable revisions include:

- Incorporation of the position of immediate Past President of the ICF-NT Board as a Board member with full voting rights
- Clarification on filling a Director vacancy or an Officer vacancy
- Alignment of the nomination and election process of Directors with that of Officers.
